- Minimum 2.95 GPA
- Currently enrolled in full-time college program
- Complete degree NLT June 30, after internship
- United States Citizen
- Possess a valid driver's license
- Pass rigorous background investigation
- Obtain and maintain a secret security clearance
- Pass all medical/physical requirements

#### PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

Internships are currently available for cyber related and forensic science degrees. Internships may convert into a full-time civilian agent position upon graduation.
